5. What task have you undertaken this last year that required perseverance and what do you think is the reward of that perseverance?

6. Integrity, honesty, generosity, moral purity, and love are all characteristics we were taught in Paul's writing and saw exhibited in his life. Select one of those and share something you remember from his teaching.

7. a. Paul spoke of Abraham's faith counting as righteousness in both Romans and Galatians. How does one's faith reflect in a person's character?

b. Write Paul's statement of faith in Romans 8:37-39.
