**THE DIVIDED KINGDOM 13-1****"THE PROPHET WHO COULDN'T HIDE FROM GOD"****Jonah 1:1-4:11****INTRODUCTION**

The Northern Kingdom of Israel had been in rebellion against God for nearly two centuries under the rulership of evil kings. We will study the messages of the "minor" prophets Jonah, Amos and Hosea as they warn of judgment to come.

5. List the ways the sailors tried to save themselves in the violent storm.
  
6. a. Jonah offered the solution in verse 12. How did the sailors respond?  
b. What was their fearful prayer?  
. . . their fearful response to God's power?

6. c. How is fear a motivating force for the world to seek God?

7. a. What deliverance did God provide for Jonah?

c. Jonah's repentance in verse 9?

10. Jonah had a "narrow escape" from tragedy. Share such an experience in your life and what you learned from it.

**DAY 4 REVIEW Jonah 3:1-10**

11. When Jonah preached the city of Ninevah repented.

a. How did they show their repentance?

b. In verse 8 how did the king acknowledge their need for repentance?

**DAY 4 (Continued) REVIEW Jonah 3:1-10**

12. If a genuine turning to God were to occur in this country, what results would you expect to see?
  
13. How did God demonstrate His compassion?

**DAY 5 REVIEW Jonah 4:1-11**

14. a. Judgment was prophesied but nothing seemed to happen (verse 5). Do you think the people of Ninevah (or modern man) would see that as God's compassion or attribute it to the ravings of a false prophet?
  
- b. Do you think we need to see God's judgment occasionally to believe the warnings in His Word? Why or why not?
  
15. What was God's object lesson of the vine?
  
16. Man's concern is selfish comfort. God's concern is a sinner's conversion. What can we do to show the world of God's concern for them?
  
17. **NEW TESTAMENT APPLICATION:** Ninevah was a city of Gentiles. What did Paul confirm in Romans 1:16?
