

Isaiah Memory Verse 2

Isaiah 3:10 Tell the righteous it will be well with them, for they will enjoy the fruit of their deeds.

This verse has deep spiritual and moral implications and the is the righteous who are reassured for their obedience and continuous faithfulness to God's standards. You and I are the community.

God says it will be well with us. This conveys a sense of peace and a wholeness even within the trials and tribulation of our live and for Judah and Israel the soon appearing of an occupying enemy who would banish them to a foreign land with nothing but slavery as their outcome.

What a promise of peace! You notice it did not say there wouldn't be challenges and tragedies, but we will prevail. When peace like a river attendeth my way, when sorrows like sea billows roll, whatever my lot thou hast taught me to say. It is well with my soul.

They shall eat the fruit of their doing. This is a statement that applies to the righteous as well as the unrighteous that is, those who parade their sin proudly.

Believe me it will be a bitter pill to swallow for those who are obstinate and do not respond to God's call. Charles H. Spurgeon reminds us "The eyes that never weep for sin here will weep in awful angst forever...It would be profitable to feel the wrath of God on our spirit now. For if not, He will crush you down and down without hope.

To the righteous however, the fruit of obedience to God, includes a deeper relation with God, growth in our character through the fruits of the spirit, a clarity of purpose, a deep joy and the manifold blessings by God culminating in an eternal fellowship and relationship eternally.

As the hymn beautifully states: Out of his infinite riches in Jesus, He giveth and giveth again. To added affliction, He addeth His mercy.
