d. What consequence did the lie bring?
9. What emotions do you see in David in these verses?
10. Think for a moment of the immensity of loss for the nation. So many had died including the leadership. The enemy was in occupation. How do you think our own country would react in a similar situation?

11. How did David describe Jonathan and Saul in verse 22?
12. What did David find comforting in verse 23?
13. a. David appeared to have loved Jonathan deeply (verse 26) and "his enemy" Saul. What is Jesus' instruction to us in Matthew 5:43-48?  
b. How did God act toward his enemies in Romans 5:10?
14. The Lord told David to go to \_\_\_\_\_. What transpired there?

15. What was David's first "official" act?

b. Share a recent battle you feel you've "won" and what part God played in it.
