**DAY 1 - READ 2 Samuel 6:1 - 7:29**

**DAY 2 - REVIEW 2 Samuel 6:1-11 and READ 1 Chronicles 13:1-14**

4. a. Why was the ark being brought to Jerusalem according to 1 Chronicles 13:3,4?
  - b. How was it being transported?
  
  - c. What was the proper method to move the ark in Exodus 37:5 and Numbers 4:15?
  
5. a. The ark represented God’s presence and was accompanied with great joy. If all cultural inhibitions were removed, how would you like to express your joy in the Lord during a worship service?
  - b. At what times are you most aware of being in “His presence?”

**DAY 2 – (Continued) REVIEW 2 Samuel 6:1-11 and READ 1 Chronicles 13:1-14**

6. a. Why did Uzzah touch the ark?
  - b. This second violation of God’s law could show how much God’s people had neglected the study of Scripture. In your opinion, why did God allow righteous judgment to come in such a violent way upon His people?
7. David was both angry and afraid. What did he do with the ark and what was the result?

**DAY 3 - REVIEW 2 Samuel 6:12-23 and READ 1 Chronicles 15:1-2, 13-16, 25-29**

8. David prepared a place for the ark in Jerusalem and went to get it. What had he learned according to these verses in 1 Chronicles 15?
  - a. vs. 2
  - b. vs. 13
  - c. vs. 15
9. a. From 2 Samuel 6:16, how did Michal feel as she observed the joyous parade?
  - b. Give two reasons you think might explain her attitude.
10. How did David bless the people?
11. a. Michal was the “rain on David’s parade.” How do you react when someone does that to you?
  - b. What do we learn in verse 23?

**DAY 4 - REVIEW 2 Samuel 7:1-17**

12. a. What concern did David share with Nathan?
  - b. According to 1 Chronicles 22:7,8, why was he not allowed to do this?
13. What points of God’s message to David in 2 Samuel 7:5-16 speak of:
  - a. past things?
  - b. God’s immediate plan?
  - c. God’s future plan?

**DAY 4 – (Continued) REVIEW 2 Samuel 7:1-17**

14. This everlasting covenant with David is expanded in Psalm 89:27-37 and fulfilled by whom according to Matthew 1:1?

**DAY 5 - REVIEW 2 Samuel 7:18-29**

15. Feel the closeness between David and his Lord in verses 18,19. Write a line of praise for the Lord who's close to you or share a time when you've experienced this kind of closeness.
16. a. How did David express . . . reverence for God? (vs.22)
- b. . . . remembrance of God's faithfulness? (vs. 23)
- c. . . . reliance in God's Word? (vs.28)
17. a. Do you think David was disappointed by God's rejection of his plan for a temple? Why or why not?
- b. One day Solomon would build the temple. In what way would God let David be a part of it according to 1 Chronicles 28:11-19?
