Job 4:1 – 7:21

1. What inspiration to your life did you find in last week's lesson?

INTRODUCTION: In chapters 4-31, Job's friends attempted to answer his question, "Why?" Each friend had his say which reflected his personality: Eliphaz "the Eloquent," Bildad "the Brutal," and Zophar "the Zealous." * Each maintained Job's sin was the cause of his suffering. As the conversations cycled, in the first round (chapters 4-14) they hinted at sin as a cause; round two (chapters 15-21) they moved from suggestion to insinuation; and by round three (chapters 22-31), it was open accusation. While the diagnoses of the friends are wrong or incomplete, do not overlook much of what they say is true (i.e., 5:9-16). *Ray C. Stedman, *Expository Studies in Job*
